### North Central London STP Analytics Board

The North Central London STP Analytics Board is being created

- To oversee the use of health and care data for analytics across the NHS and local government to support improved outcomes in population health and integrated care. The group will involve health and care professionals and senior analysts from across NCL as well as local academic partners, working together to identify where we need to work more closely together and how we can do that to improve health and wellbeing outcomes; consider best practice; and ensure that this is all being done in an ethical, acceptable, and transparent way.

The Analytics Board aims to ensure that NCL population health analytics programme achieve its objectives:

- To improve outcomes and reduce health inequalities through a whole systems approach to analytics across the health and care system in north central London, by using data in a way that is acceptable to patients and residents.
- Consider and approve the proposed use of data for analytics across NCL and ensure that proposals are effective and in line with information governance frameworks.

### How you can get involved?

By applying to become one of the two residents' representatives who have knowledge and/or experience of using health services within north central London. As a residents' representative you will bring your experiences into discussions.



### Who can apply?

- Anyone living in one of the five boroughs of the north central London area (Barnet, Camden, Enfield, Haringey, Islington).
- Volunteers who can commit to approximately 10 hours every month (including attending meetings and reading briefing papers).
- Volunteers who are passionate and committed to improving the quality of care for patients across north central London.

### What you will be doing? - Role Description

1. To attend the bimonthly analytics board to represent the views of residents and patients.
2. To give a feedback in how the residents should be informed about the uses of their medical data.
3. To contribute representing residents' views with regards to using of data for medical research.
4. To represent patients and the residents, ensuring that their voice is heard and informs Analytic Board work.
5. To proactively support a programme of resident and patient engagement around the use of data for analytics across the health and care system, and to participate in workshops or other engagement events as required.
6. To complete a short evaluation every three months to report on the impact their contribution has had on the decisions of the group. A copy of the evaluations will be given to the Chair of the group.
7. To participate in a wider NCL Residents engagement support group bimonthly.

### What we can offer to you?

1. We will hold a short induction session to support you in the new role and ongoing support will be offered to you from the programme manager.
2. We will ensure that you will be supported by the programme manager to understand the content of the reports and documents and any use of jargon will be explained.
3. If you request it, hard copies will be sent out to you in addition to electronic copies. Reports and other Papers should be circulated and arrive at least five working days in advance of the meeting to provide adequate time for reading.
4. The programme manager will be your contact in the event of any further support issues arising.
5. Travel expenses, following NLP expenses policy, will be paid on production of receipts.
6. Develop new skills and knowledge working within the health and care system
7. A future reference, based on your involvement in the programme.
