North Central London STP Neurology Transformation Group

The North Central London STP Neurology Transformation Group came together to review current neurology services in NCL and identify ways of improving the care that patients receive. The group involves neurology consultants and GP representatives from across NCL, working together to identify problems and find solutions; consider best practice; review the latest evidence and see what has worked well nationally.

The Neurology transformation group aims to ensure that NCL neurology programme achieve its objectives:

- To develop and implement primary care patient pathways
- To develop and implement secondary care patient pathways
- To develop and implement a GP Neurology helpline
- To scope the viability of a greater neurology presence in A&E

How you can get involved?

By applying to become one of the two residents' representatives who have knowledge and/or experience of using health services within north central London. As a residents' representative you will bring your experiences into discussions.

Who can apply?

- Anyone living in one of the five boroughs of the north central London area (Barnet, Camden, Enfield, Haringey, Islington).
- Volunteers who can commit to approximately 4 hours every month (including attending meetings and reading briefing papers).



- Volunteers who are passionate and committed to improving the quality of care for patients across north central London.

What you will be doing? - Role Description

1. To attend monthly Neurology transformation group meetings (2 hours). The meetings usually alternate between Russell Square and Cockfosters.
2. To input into the meeting discussions from the perspective of a patient/resident perspective.
3. To look at typical patient experience and commenting on these.
4. To review other documents, for example a service specification.
5. To identify opportunities for engaging with the wider community and support the programme with this. To participate in workshops or other engagement events as required.
6. To complete a short evaluation every three months to report on the impact their contribution has had on the decisions of the group. A copy of the evaluations will be given to the Chair of the group.
7. To participate in NCL Residents engagement support group bimonthly.

What we can offer to you?

1. We will hold a short induction session to support you in the new role and ongoing support will be offered to you from the programme manager.
2. We will ensure that you will be supported by the programme manager to understand the content of the reports and documents and any use of jargon will be explained.
3. If you request it, hard copies will be sent out to you in addition to electronic copies. Reports and other Papers should be circulated and arrive at least five working days in advance of the meeting to provide adequate time for reading.
4. The programme manager will be your contact in the event of any further support issues arising.
5. Travel expenses, following NLP expenses policy, will be paid on production of receipts.
6. Develop new skills and knowledge working within the health and care system
7. A future reference, based on your involvement in the programme.
